TITLE: Avian Care Intern—VINS Nature Center, Quechee, Vermont

SUMMARY: VINS Avian Care Interns gain extensive hands-on training in raptor captive management, education bird handling and training and avian rehabilitation.

REPORTS TO: Lead Wildlife Keeper, Center for Wild Bird Rehabilitation

UPDATED: January 2019

Duties:

- Provide captive management and husbandry for over 60 raptors and other wildlife used for programs and in exhibits.
- Assist staff with medical care of rehabilitation birds.
- Clean and maintain all indoor and outdoor animal facilities and aviaries.
- Perform daily husbandry tasks for all permanent residents used in educational programs and exhibits.
- Provide emergency care, feed, carry out medical treatments, and monitor health status.
- Assist finders of injured and orphaned birds and arrange transportation and rescue.
- Admit injured and orphaned birds.
- Hand-feed baby songbirds on feeding schedule.

Location:

The Vermont Institute of Natural Science in Quechee, Vermont includes the Nature Center, Raptor Exhibits and the Center for Wild Bird Rehabilitation. This private, non-profit organization was founded in 1972 and provides environmental education, field research and avian rehabilitation. The institute is located in the scenic countryside of east central Vermont approximately 2 1/2 hours from Boston and 1 1/2 hours from Burlington. VINS — Avian Care Internship

Qualifications:

- Have enthusiasm.
- Ability to work both independently and in a team.
- Strong interest in birds and wildlife husbandry.
- Willingness to work long, hard, irregular hours in all weather conditions.
- 18 years or older.
- Hold a valid driver's license, and have own transportation.
- Physical capacity to catch and treat large birds, lift equipment weighing up to 40 pounds, climb stairs, walk preserve and carry equipment for routine maintenance.
- Ability to work quickly & efficiently while following directions & procedures.
- Have updated tetanus vaccination at time of beginning internship.
- Available to work 40 hours per week.
- Have college degree, working towards a degree or have equivalent wildlife experience.

Length of Internship:

- 6 months minimum, 40 hours per week.

Amenities:

Housing plus a stipend of \$280 every 2-week pay period.
