BACKGROUND

Founded in 1972, the Vermont Institute of Natural Science (VINS) is a nonprofit environmental education organization based in Quechee, Vermont. VINS' mission is to motivate individuals and communities to care for the environment through education, research and avian wildlife rehabilitation.

NATURE CENTER

The VINS Nature Center serves as the center of VINS' organizational operations, a resource for Vermont and New Hampshire residents, and a destination for tourists to the region. The 47-acre campus features interpretive nature trails, exhibit spaces, adventure playscape, classrooms and state-of-the-art raptor enclosures.

The Nature Center's self-guided nature trails wind visitors through a floodplain forest and along the Ottauquechee River, noting important natural features along the way, and through an upland meadow with established native wildflower species.

VINS invites visitors to explore the Forest Exhibit, which captures the sights, sounds and smells of a natural forest. Discover common trees in our area and how to identify them. Investigate the amazing diversity of mammals, birds, reptiles and insects that call the forest home. Also explore our Adventure Playscape, a natural place for children with elements for creative play and fun for all ages.

RESEARCH / CITIZEN SCIENCE

Most citizen science projects are completely free, and involve observing the natural world, then entering observations online. For as little as 15 minutes once a year, or a little time every day, citizen scientists help conduct real, urgently needed scientific research. Projects include ProjectFeeder Watch, eBird, NestWatch, and Great Backyard Bird Count.
